CHANGES AND CANCELLATION

CHANGES TO YOUR BOOKING:

- Changes must be made at least 2 weeks (not inclusive of visit date) in advance. Any changes made after will not be accommodated.

CANCELLATION OF YOUR BOOKING:

- For cancellations made with less than 1 working week (not inclusive of visit date), 50% of the total payment will be levied.
- For cancellations made with less than 3 working days (not inclusive of visit date), the total payment (i.e. 100%) will be levied.

KALIMBA TO THE TUNES OF XINYAO! **



Prior booking required at least 5 weeks in advance.

Are there songs composed by Singaporeans? What is Xinyao, and what are some classic songs from that era?

In this session, students will explore the evolution of Mandarin music in Singapore through a guided tour, discovering locally composed songs and the cultural context in which they were created. They will also learn about the history and significance of Xinyao, a grassroots music movement that emerged in the 1980s and became an important part of Singapore's cultural landscape.

During the workshop, students will be introduced to the kalimba, a melodic thumb piano. They will learn to play a Xinyao song and gain hands-on appreciation of this distinctly Singaporean musical genre.

Through examining artefacts, stories, and examples of everyday life, students will gain deeper insight into how multicultural influences have shaped the community's identity across different time periods.

What are the origins of Chinese culture? How have cultural interactions shaped Singaporean creativity? Which local brands have put Singapore on the global map?

In this inquiry-based guided tour, students will explore early migration, Chinese dialect groups, and how cultural interactions have influenced local food, language, and creative expression. They will also discover homegrown brands that have put Singapore on the global map, gaining a deeper understanding of how culture continues to shape creativity today.

RETURN TO XINYAO ROOTS WITH UKULELE! **


Prior booking required at least 5 weeks in advance.

Are there songs composed by Singaporeans? What is Xinyao, and what are some classic songs from that era?

In this session, students will dive into the evolution of Mandarin music in Singapore through a guided tour, discovering homegrown songs and the stories behind them. They will learn about Xinyao, a youth-driven music movement from the 1980s that captured the hopes, friendships, and everyday experiences of Singaporean students, much like themselves.

During the workshop, students learn to play a Xinyao song on the ukulele and experience how this uniquely Singaporean genre blends storytelling, emotion, and music in a way that continues to inspire young people today.

REMIX IT! WITH THE IPAD**



In this session, students will explore the history and evolution of local Chinese culture through a guided tour, with a special focus on Singapore Mandarin music. They will learn how musical styles have changed over time, from early classics and the Xinyao movement to modern works by artists such as S.K. Poon.

During the workshop, students will also learn to use the iPad GarageBand app to create their own remix of a local Mandarin song, giving them hands-on experience in music production and creative expression.

STITCHING THE CHINESE SINGAPOREAN STORY**

Prior booking required at least 5 weeks in advance.

What is Singapore Chinese culture, and what are the complexities that shape it?

In this in-depth, inquiry-driven guided tour, tertiary students will critically examine how Singapore Chinese culture has been constructed, negotiated, and continually reshaped across different time periods. Through observation, reflection, and facilitated discussions, students will explore the interconnectedness between historical developments, state policies, community values, and everyday cultural practices. They will also consider how these factors influence contemporary identity formation and the future trajectory of the community.

Choose between a focused tour covering three thematic zones; history, policies, values, festivals, and local lingo and food, or a comprehensive tour of all five zones offering a holistic understanding of Singapore Chinese culture.


